# ELA at GUG MS2

School Year 2024-2025



Text(s)	Themes/Topics
Seedfolks	Students explore the theme of community through the book <i>Seedfolks</i> , wrestling with how prejudice and racism impact the way people treat each other and the ways in which that can influence a community.
The Breadwinner, I Am Malala, Kids of Kabul	Students explore the Taliban's influence on the Middle East through the lens of human rights in the book <i>The Breadwinner</i> , and practice narrative writing by rewriting scenes from other point of views.
Trash Vortex	Students explore how plastic pollution is choking the world's oceans, and explore a variety of solutions for reducing plastic waste and reducing the amount of plastic that ends up in the ocean.
Witnesses to Freedom, Freedom's Children, Claudette Colvin: Twice Toward Justice, Turning 15 on the Road to Freedom, Selma, Lord, Selma	Young Heroes: Children of the Civil Rights Movement. Students study the Civil Rights Movement through the eyes of the children who experienced its hardships, victories and defeats firsthand by reading and analyzing multiple accounts of the same event.
Return to Sender	Friendship Across Boundaries. Students begin to explore the complexity of immigration and immigrant rights by reading the core text <i>Return to Sender</i> . Through the eyes of two children, <i>Return to Sender</i> highlights the challenges of life for Mexican laborers in Vermont and how stereotypes about undocumented workers are formed.

Text(s)	Themes/Topics
The Watsons Go to Birmingham - 1963	Students explore the topic of coming of age through the story of an African-American boy growing up during the civil rights era, and his family's strong bond in the face of tragedy.
The Giver	Students explore the topic of "coming of age" through the story of one boy's life in a dystopian future, and his growing understanding that the world around him is not what it appears.
Life in Motion: An Unlikely Ballerina, Assorted Articles/Videos	Expressing Yourself: Women in the Arts. Students explore the topic of coming of age through stories about the experiences of professional female artists of color who have fought to claim their space in a world that has long excluded people who look like them.
The Outsiders	Finding Connection. Students explore the topic of coming of age through the story of a young man struggling to determine right and wrong in a world defined by violence.
Refugee, The Unwanted: Stories of the Syrian Refugees	Fleeing Conflict. Students explore the topic of "coming of age" through the stories of young refugees from different time periods, all of whom face unthinkable hardships as they desperately seek safety.



Text(s)	Themes/Topics
Assorted Poems, Essays, and Short Stories	Students explore the different ways individuals develop a sense of belonging through a variety of voices, texts, and genres.
Uprising, Flesh & Blood So Cheap	Students explore how meaningful social change comes about through close study of the tragic Triangle Shirtwaist fire and the social history of the early 20th century.
A Raisin in the Sun	Students continue to explore what it means to belong and how race, gender, and class shape a person's identity through the story (play) of an African American family living on the south side of Chicago in the 1950s.
The House on Mango Street	Students explore the American experience through the eyes of a young Latina as she struggles to define herself in relation to her community. <i>The House on Mango Street</i> continues students' year-long study of what it means to be American, as it provides a nuanced picture of the Mexican-American experience, as well as raising questions about what it means to be young and female in America.
American Born Chinese	Students continue their year-long interrogation of the American Dream by reading the acclaimed graphic novel <i>American Born Chinese</i> . The reader follows protagonist Jin, the son of Chinese immigrants, as he navigates the standard experiences of being a young person coming of age in America, as well as the unique challenges of being Asian-American in a predominantly white community. <i>American Born Chinese</i> explores themes around identity, stereotypes, friendship, and self-acceptance.



Text(s)	Themes/Topics
All American Boys	The first 8th-grade unit initiates a year-long exploration of injustice and responses to oppression. In this unit, students will explore issues of racial injustice in the United States. The core text, <i>All American Boys</i> , is a novel that tells the story of two teenage boys—one white and one Black—as they tackle racism and police brutality in their community.
Night, The Diary of Anne Frank	Students explore human nature through the memoir of Elie Wiesel, a Holocaust survivor who vividly describes the horrors he experienced.
To Kill a Mockingbird	Seeking Justice: Students explore human nature through the story of a young white girl facing the harsh realities of racial injustice in the Jim Crow south.
Persepolis	Students explore human nature through the story of a young girl coming of age during the Iranian Revolution, and the challenges she faced during this violent, turbulent time.
An Inconvenient Sequel: Truth to Power, Assorted Texts/Articles	Students will learn about one of the most urgent issues facing the planet today: climate change. While they will undoubtedly be familiar with the basic facts of climate change, this unit aims to provide students with some of the information and analytical tools needed to engage with this complex topic. They will conclude the unit by taking action and writing a persuasive letter to their elected officials, drawing on the texts they have studied throughout the unit.
